
Thomas Wolsey was born in 1473, and was educated at Magdalen College School. His influence, both political and ecclesiastical, in England in the early 16th century was immense: in his lifetime, he held the positions of Archbishop of York, Lord Chancellor, Cardinal and adviser to Henry VIII. This portrait hangs in the Dining Hall at MCS.

To make the journey from School House to School Field, you must cross the School's iconic white bridges. They are a thrilling sight throughout the year, but are particularly pristine in winter, and glorious in summer.

While the summer weather allows pupils to sing madrigals from punts, there is very little opportunity for such river forays in winter. But in 1940, a small group of boys attempted their own river voyage, undeterred by freezing conditions. Records suggest that they went on to become a Marine Commando, a naval photographer, a fighter pilot, and a millionaire.







Bishop William Waynflete founded Magdalen College School in 1480. He was distinctive in his rise to the higher echelons – he started from the position of a school teacher. He wanted his school in Oxford to teach Latin so that its pupils would be able to learn and exchange ideas when they went on to the emerging university.

Latin is still taught to all pupils today and now, almost five and a half centuries later, Magdalen College School is one of the top ten schools in the UK.
